# Swinton Reading Room And Community Hall

Swinton Reading Rooms has been the home of Swinton Playgroup for 35 years and has seen many children progress over the years.

We are now looking at a suggestion to benefit the playgroup and, hopefully, other users of the hall in the future.

Currently the Playgroup use the hall Tuesday to Thursday, but changes in the government funding for childcare means that they need to provide 30 hours per week childcare to remain viable.

At the moment equipment needs to be brought out and put away to allow other users access to the main hall.

Although this has worked in the past it is time consuming and physically difficult to carry this out especially over 5 days rather than 3.

A suggestion has been put forward which makes sense, but does impact on the snooker room. The Plan would be for the Playgroup to rent the snooker room rather than the man hall. This would allow

them to leave equipment out at all times and would free up one of the storage sheds for storage of chairs etc that would not fit in the office.

It also gives them direct access and views of the outside play area which is beneficial to the children.

The main loss to the Reading Rooms would be the snooker table, but this has limited use with only a small amount of rent being generated each year. We will make enquiries as to the value and removal of the table as part of the proposed project.

It could have some value which could be used for the improvement of the Reading Rooms.

The use of the snooker room would not restrict access to the disabled toilet when other users are in the main hall although we would still not have the ability to rent out both rooms at the same time as Playgroup do need access to the kitchen and toilets.

The committee considered it a

good suggestion and Playgroup are to come forward with plans as to how this would logistically work.

It would mean extra rental for the Reading Rooms and perhaps the opportunity to have another "blitz" on cleaning and maintenance with the help of some willing volunteers from the village.

The intention is for the village to lodge any objections, points of view to this proposal by 31 December 2016 otherwise we will give the Playgroup the opportunity to start putting plans in place with a view to September 2017 start up. Please be assured that this will not detrimentally affect any other users of the Reading Rooms.

North Yorkshire trading standards have received a number of reports recently from local residents and businesses being approached by persons claiming to be workmen from nearby road works. These workmen claim they have tarmac left over and are offering driveways and pathways at

reduced prices.

These workmen are bogus and the work completed is often of poor quality and vastly overpriced.

Residents are warned not to engage with these workmen.

Hovingham A house in Park Street was burgled on Friday 16th September between 9.45 and 11 am. The culprit got access through a ground floor rear window, and stole some jewellery.

Be careful! Make sure all doors and windows are locked even in the middle of the day!

A report has been taken of a security company making telephone calls to residents in Marton and wishing to attend home addresses to discuss security systems. Tel No noted was 01642697970

(Middlesbrough) and reportee states when attempts were made to phone back, the number was not accepting calls.

Terrifying 'knocker' SCAM:
Police forces across the country have been issuing alerts after a wave of crimes involving gangs of men who claim to be selling cleaning products but actually are scoping out the victims house in preparation for a burglary at a later date. The scam often involves sellers, also known as Nottingham Knockers, who claim to be a reformed convict

trying to make a new life for themselves or to be deaf or dumb and in need of cash to pay for their carer. The crooks go between houses appearing to offer a range of cleaning products but are secretly checking how much cash may be in the house, whether the home is occupied or empty at certain times, how valuable the belongings are and how well protected the house is. A few days or weeks later, a different member of the gang returns to burgle the house using the intelligence gathered by the initial doorstep trader. Some scammers reportedly even sniff the bank notes they are paid with to judge whether they may have come from a larger wad of cash being stored somewhere in the house. So-named because the original scammers hailed from Nottingham and would come knocking door-to-door to trade their wares, the scam has spread across the country, sparking a number of police alerts. Forces across the country have issued warnings to vulnerable residents, especially the elderly, to be on their guard. In some cases doorstep hawkers have forced their way inside a property after being told to go away. Those who do pay up risk being added to a list of willing customers and are then targeted by other street sellers. # Swinton And District Horticultural Society

#### November

Winter is on its way Leaves are falling rapidly, and wind and rain are on the increase.

Tender plants will need protecting from frost, gales and freezing rains.

Move plants into the greenhouse, or into a sheltered spot, but if you can't, it is worth wrapping plants or pots in situ.

Remember winter can be a tough time for birds in terms of water and food, so keep supplies well topped up. Top 10 jobs this month

- 1 Clear up fallen leaves especially from lawns, ponds and beds.
- 2 Raise containers onto pot feet to prevent water logging.
- 3 Plant tulip bulbs for a spring display next year.
- 4 Prune roses to prevent wind rock.
- 5 Plant out winter bedding.
- 6 Cover brassicas with netting if pigeons are a problem.
- 7 Insulate outdoor containers from frost, bubble wrap works

well.

- 8 Stop winter moth damage to fruit trees using grease bands around the trunks.
- 9 Put out bird food to encourage winter birds into the garden.
- 10 Use a seasonal bonfire, where this is allowed, to dispose of excess debris unfit for composting.
